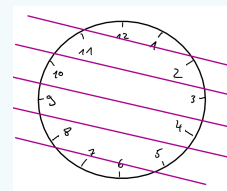
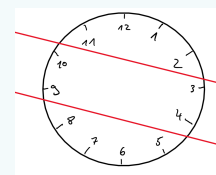
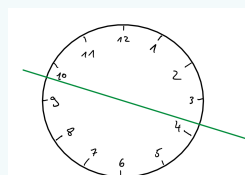
Riddle of the month
